How do I get connected?

If you have a disability and want a promising career ahead, your middle or high school can refer you to a vocational rehabilitation counselor near you so can start planning now.

What's in it for me?

With E³, you will have one-on-one support throughout school as you build skills that will help you get a job or pursue more education.

Assessment: You and your counselor will learn more about your interests and what you need to start planning a successful career.

Training: Develop academic and job-related skills while you're in school or college and after.

Job Placement: Help you launch a career doing something you love by connecting you to a work opportunity.

On-the-Job Support: We stay with you while you get comfortable at work and make sure you have the support needed to succeed.





E³ is a chance for you to explore your future career options as early as middle school. Here's how it works:

What am I good at?

Find your strengths through games and quizzes and learn how they can be used in a career.

What do I like to do?

Explore different jobs and figure out what you do and don't enjoy.

Where will it take me?

After discovering your skills and abilities, likes and dislikes, uncover the career opportunities that are a good fit.
